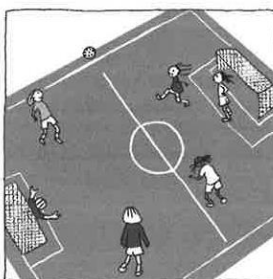

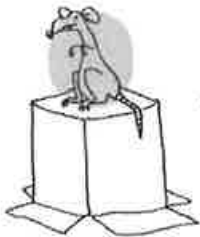

The Disney movie *Frozen* was first released in November 2013. It is loosely based on the story *The snow queen* by Hans Christian Andersen.

The story is set in a fantasy land called Arendelle. It looks a lot like Norway with high mountains and icy fjords. There is a castle with a King and Queen. They have two young daughters, Elsa and Anna. Elsa has special powers. She can make things freeze. Having power is fun, but dangerous, too. As a young girl, Elsa does not know how to control her powers.

One day, Elsa hurts Anna with her ice. She hits Anna in the head, and Anna is frozen. Their parents take Anna to the mountain trolls for the troll king to heal her. The troll king says that as long as it is the head not the heart, she will be OK. She is no longer frozen.

Sadly, the King and Queen of Arendelle die when they are on a journey. Elsa becomes queen of Arendelle. Anna falls in love with a young prince. She wants to marry him, but is he right for her? Elsa says Anna is not allowed to marry him. They have a big argument, and during that, Elsa reveals her powers. Everyone gets scared, and Elsa escapes to the North Mountain. Anna goes on a quest to find her.

On her way to reconnect with Elsa, Anna meets Kristoff and his reindeer Sven. Kristoff and Sven help Anna find Elsa, to rescue Arendelle, which is buried in deep snow and eternal winter.

In a moment of despair, Elsa hits Anna in the heart, and Anna is weakening. The only cure for her is true love. Will she ever get well? Will the sisters become friends again and will Anna find the right man for her?
